

Turkey Hill Ice Cream

More than 85 years ago, in the southern end of Pennsylvania Dutch Country, Armor Frey started each day by watching the sunrise from the top of Turkey Hill. Then he'd toss a few bottles of milk into the back of his touring sedan and set off to sell them to his neighbors. It was the Great Depression, and every penny helped.

In 1980, the Frey brothers took the biggest step in the life of the dairy by expanding its ice cream production. Turkey Hill Ice Cream quickly became a favorite in local Lancaster County stores.

In 1981, they persuaded a few independent stores in the Philadelphia area to give "Turkey Who?" a try. Philadelphians loved it. The ice cream was always good, but priced so everyone could enjoy it. Light ice cream soon followed. Then frozen yogurt.

Little by little, this tiny dairy became a favorite in some of the country's biggest markets.

Zeigler's

Maurice Zeigler began selling his blends in 1932, having a family friend press his cider to sell at local farm stands. They advertised via homemade flyers with original poems. In a time where most Americans were just focusing on surviving, Maurice did something consistent with most successful entrepreneurs: he bravely took a risk. In 1935, Maurice bought a cider press, put it in the shed behind their house, and turned it into Zeigler's first cider mill.

Since these modest beginnings, Zeigler's has spent nearly a century enjoying consistent growth. Land was purchased in Lansdale, PA in the early 1940's, and distribution grew to include direct sale to area supermarkets. That radius grew to the greater New Jersey and Pennsylvania areas, and in 1968, now with Maurice's sons and son-in-law at the helm, Zeigler's was incorporated.

Habbersett

From their early start in 1863 in Middletown, Delaware County, Pennsylvania, the Habbersett brand has been creating great-tasting scrapple using the highest quality ingredients. Founded by Isaac S. Habbersett and passed through many family generations, Habbersett has developed into an iconic Philadelphia tradition. Originally located in Media, Pennsylvania, their famous scrapple is now produced in Delaware.

With a staff of nearly 50 people, Habbersett Brand is the market leader for scrapple in the Philadelphia area. Their distribution center in Bridgeville, Delaware also distributes their products throughout the northeast region.

Day's Soda

It all began with a petty theft. Alfred DiGirolamo, known to his friends as "Freddy Day," was caught stealing a case of soda off of a delivery truck on the streets of south Philadelphia. Unable to make a successful getaway, Freddy Day was caught by the truck driver and given an option: either be turned in to the police or work off his transgression by assisting the truck driver. Freddy chose the latter option and there is when he discovered his calling.

After working various jobs in the beverage industry, Freddy founded the Day's Beverage Company in 1946 and successfully operated until his death in 1967. Soon after, the company was shuttered and the Day's brand lay dormant for the next 30 years.

The Day's brand was resurrected in 1997 by Freddy's sons, David and Freddy Jr., and now in its third generation of family ownership, has grown to become one of the largest independent private-label soft drink companies in the United States. Days Soda is Headquartered in Yeadon, Pennsylvania.


