389K Jobs

SNAP supports nearly **250,000** jobs in community grocery stores and over **139,000** additional jobs in related sectors like agriculture, manufacturing, transportation, and municipal services.



\$20B in Wages

Grocery store employees who help implement SNAP in their stores earn about **\$10.3 billion** in pay. Workers in supporting industries bring the total over **\$20.1 billion**.



\$2.6B Federal Taxes

Sales tax isn't applied to SNAP purchases, but SNAP sales generate additional economic activity that brought in over **\$2.6 billion** in federal tax revenue.



\$1.9B State and Local Taxes

SNAP associated sales and administration at the grocery store level contributed to more than **\$1.9 billion** in state and local tax revenue.
